This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Our school music curriculum is informed by the <u>model music curriculum</u> (March 2021), nonstatutory guidance for teaching music from Key Stages 1. We work in partnership with Bolton Music service and Kapow for our music lessons and assessments. In KS2 we employ Junior Jam to deliver high quality Music lessons by experienced music teachers.
- All children in KS1 are taught by the class teacher and follow the Kapow scheme of work. A brief outline of what is taught can be found on our school website under music curriculum. We play percussion instruments and have weekly vocal singing sessions within the classroom.

- KS2 will have the opportunity to play a range of different musical instruments with in the weekly hour lesson taught by Junior Jam. This includes keyboards, glockenspiels, bamboo Tambo and percussion instruments. We have weekly singing sessions in assemblies and we also offer a school choir.
- We work in partnership with our local music hub Bolton Music service. They offer weekly
 instrument lessons in school. The instrumental lessons are guitar, violin, vocal and Brass. The
 fee is £25 per month and they offer a hire of musical instruments for an additional small fee.
 We have a high percentage of children who choose to play an additional musical instrument
 and are very successful with children achieving a grade 1 or 2 by year 6 from the Royal College
 of Music London.

Part B: Music Tuition Choirs and Ensembles

- We work in partnership with our local music hub Bolton Music service. They offer weekly
 instrument lessons in school. The instrumental lessons are guitar, violin, vocal and Brass. The
 fee is £25 per month and they offer a hire of musical instruments for an additional small fee.
 We have a high percentage of children who chose to play an additional musical instrument and

- School Choir is offered to any child in year 3 to year 6 on a Monday night 3.20pm-4.00pm.
