Where is...	Où est...?
There is/are	Il y a / ont
Where do you live?	Où habites-tu?
I live in....	J'habite à / en

France Facts

France is nicknamed 'l'Hexagone' (the Hexagon) because of its shape.

Determiners

The (masculine)	Le
The (feminine)	La
The (plural)	Les
A or one (masculine)	Un
A or one (feminine)	Une
Some (plural)	Des
My (masculine)	Mon
My (feminine)	Ma
My (plural)	Mes

Generally, if a French noun ends in an **e**, it's probably feminine. E.g. une chaussette (a sock), une porte (a door). Of course, there are LOTS of exceptions!

The word **j'ai** means **I have**

The word is actually two words put together: **je** (I) and **ai** (have).

Fifteen	Quinze (kans)	Twenty	Vingt (van)
